We, the delegations of AAPTIC members, during the Conference from 16 – 19 July 2012 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, have agreed to the conclusions as follows:


- a. Offer the chairmanship of AAPTIC and host of the 2013 conference to Mongolia.
- b. Welcome Japan, New Zealand, and South Korea as AAPTIC members.
- c. Agree to share training materials, schedules of broad interest on the AAPTIC web portal, and to explore and share instructional staff and students as feasible
- d. Amended the Articles of Association effective 19 July 2012 to expand the Association vision and purpose and clarify membership and organizational matters.
- e. Will invite Brunei and Singapore as observers and will invite Pakistan and China to join as members
- f. Will contact United Nations Department of Peacekeeping Operations regarding training materials for Protection of Civilians, to clarify expectations and to offer assistance in this regard.
- g. To encourage Indonesia to consider hosting the 2014 IAPTIC Annual General Meeting.
- h. Will consider appropriately the efforts of other regional and sub-regional peacekeeping groupings when planning and coordinating activities and message.
- i. Will respond to the request of US Peace Operations Training Institute's request to join that they will be allowed to attend the AAPTIC as an Invitee when appropriate.
- j. Will endeavour to develop materials and informative pamphlets about member institutions for inclusion in the 2012 IAPTIC Ideas Bazaar; materials need to be passed to local US Embassy Staff to be delivered to Hawaii by 1 September for further shipment to Finland.

- k. Extend our heartfelt appreciation to Malaysian Peacekeeping Training Centre for their leadership as chairman and for the organization of this year's meeting and thank US Pacific Command and GPOI for their kind support.


