

ASSOCIATION OF ASIA-PACIFIC PEACE OPERATIONS TRAINING CENTERS (AAPTC)
ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
YEAR 2013

We, the delegations of AAPTC members, during the Conference from 1 - 4 July 2013 in Ulaanbaatar Mongolia, have agreed to the conclusions as follows;

- a. Offer the chairmanship of AAPTC and host of the 2014 conference to Nepal.
- b. Welcome Canada and China as AAPTC members.
- c. Will invite Brunei, Singapore, and Vietnam as observers and will invite Pakistan military and Pakistan National University of Science and Technology to participate in the 2014 AAPTC annual meeting.
- d. Will respond to Germany's request to join that they will be allowed to attend the AAPTC as an Observer.
- e. Agree to share training materials, schedules of broad interest on the AAPTC web portal, and to explore and share instructional staff and students as feasible.
- f. Will strive to actively support UN's Peacekeeping Community of Practice by providing lessons learned, course information, and training best practices as practical and to keep current on materials found on the UN's Peacekeeping Resources Hub.
- g. To encourage members to review the "Regional Priorities; Perspectives on Training" presentation and provide feedback to AAPTC Secretariat by mid-September in order to include recommendations in time for presentation at October's IAPTC meeting in Cairo
- h. Will consider appropriately the efforts of other regional and sub-regional peacekeeping groupings when planning and coordinating activities and message.
- i. Will request through the AAPTC Secretariat or individually to other institutions requesting support for courses, for course materials, or other means to meet training needs and to address training gaps related to peace operations.
- j. Adopt the recommendations for consideration from the Operations working group for integration of Training Schedules and Courses of the member institutions for 2014 - 2015.
- k. Adopt the recommendations from the Operations working group for consideration of support in terms of exchange of instructors or Subject Matter Experts or other support from other institutions bilaterally.
- l. Adopt the appropriate recommendations from the Instructors and Operations working groups for consideration of means and methods to gather, analyze, and share best practices and lessons learned.
- m. Encourage member institutions to support the development of UN Military Capability Standards, Protection of Civilian training, and all other initiatives as briefed by the Integrated Training Service and Office of Military Affairs.
- n. Extend our heartfelt appreciation to Mongolian Armed Forces and Mongolian Peacekeeping Training Centre for their leadership as chairman and for the organization of this year's meeting and thank US Pacific Command and GPOI for their kind support.

In keeping with the Articles of Association of the Asia-Pacific Peace Operations Training Centres (AAPTC), we affirm our commitment to ensure the highest quality of training of peacekeepers for United Nations peace operations.




