<u>Guided</u> by the principles enshrined in the Preamble of the United Nations Charter and its Articles signed by all the Member States of the Association, to maintain international peace and security,

<u>Fully aware</u> of the important role played by the United Nations and Member States to maintain international peace and security for the peaceful settlement of disputes supported by United Nations peace operations,

<u>Having examined</u> the Requirements of the Peacekeeping Capability Readiness System (PCRS) and its aims to establish a more predictable and dynamic process of interaction between the Department of Peace Operations and Member States for ensuring readiness in timely deployment of the highest quality peacekeeping capability,

Noting further the Priorities of the Implementation Plan of the "Report on Enhancing the Safety and Security of Peacekeepers" (the Dos Santos Cruz report).

<u>Emphasizing</u> increased participation of female peacekeepers through the expansion of training opportunities and their employment in conventional military and leadership roles in peacekeeping operations,

<u>Guided</u> by the Articles of Association, with a vision to be the leading forum for training and execution of United Nations peace operations around the world,

<u>Recalling</u> the Purpose of the Association, to enhance the operational readiness of peacekeepers by advancing Asia Pacific Peace Operations Training Institutions, in conjunction with wider regional and global governmental and non-governmental efforts through the sharing of resources, sharing of best practices and lessons learnt, synergizing efforts amongst regional organizations, training and education, information sharing, and attendance at the Annual General Meeting.

Emphasizing the importance of the Organization's message to improve peace operations by the Association's adoption of the theme of "Stepping Up to the Challenge: The Asia-Pacific Actions and Responses to Increasing Effective Performance in United Nations Peacekeeping Operations" for its 2019 Annual General Meeting and Workshop proceedings,

Recognizing the full range of challenges faced in contemporary peace operations,

<u>Realizing</u> that improvements in contemporary peace operations require more effective implementation of higher standards in all areas of training and operations,

<u>Recognizing</u> the importance of A4P with the commitment by the members to embrace a growth mindset in response to the challenges to the contemporary peace operations environment,

<u>Desiring</u> to further energize the Association's efforts to be a positive agent for change and continuous improvement for the Members.

The Members of the Association at the Annual General Meeting,

 <u>Congratulates and Expresses its Appreciation</u> to the United Nations and Member States for the development of new and updated policies, guidelines, standards, and other efforts made by the Organization to support improvements in peace operations training;





- 2. Supports the call for change to address the challenges of contemporary peace operations;
- <u>Calls upon</u> the Members of the Association to embrace the efforts to improve peace operations through training;
- Encourages the Members of the Association to implement the policies, guidelines, standards, and other efforts designed to improve the training of peacekeepers and their inmission performance;
- 5. <u>Emphasizes</u> the need to address improvements in training and other areas that enhance the ability of peacekeepers to play an integral role in the Protection of Civilians and take actions to maintain the highest standards of conduct, strengthening the legitimacy of the United Nations and its Missions, and honoring the brave men and women who continue to serve and those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the cause of peace;
- <u>Support</u> the United Nations Department of Peace Operations in preparing the 'Mission Specific Training Needs Assessments';
- Encourage members to send feedback to United Nations Department of Peace Operations on specialized training materials;
- <u>Deeply Expresses its Appreciation</u> to the United Nations Department of Peace Operations for continued support to the members of the Association and its attending Observers of the latest developments in the Organization to address and assist Member States in implementing improvements to peace operations training;
- <u>Recommends</u> that the United Nations Department of Peace Operations and United Nations Department of Operational Support endeavor to improve processes for more expedient delivery of equipment into mission for deployed contingents;
- <u>Recommends</u> that the Integrated Training Service quickly and inclusively communicates changes to any peacekeeping training requirements in support of the members' aims to improve mandate implementation;

- 12. <u>Extends an Invitation</u> to the Organization to participate in the Association's next Annual Meeting and Workshop to be held in the Socialist Republic of Vietnam in 2020;
