ratio of 1:2:3 for elderly, middle-aged and youth

officers and soldiers is 1:7
corporals, sergeants, staff sergeants and master sergeants is usually 2:4:3:1

ESTABLISH A FULL ELIMINATION MECHANISM



Training and assessment results, physical examination conclusions, and mental health are comprehensively evaluated.

Candidates are usually selected based on 120% of the total number of personnel.



Female peacekeepers is one of the priorities.

STRENGTHEN TARGETED TRAINING



Training content should focus on the actual situation, security threats in mission fields, and highlighting the practical training courses.
