ratio of 1:2:3 for elderly, middle-aged and youth

officers and soldiers is 1:7 corporals, sergeants, staff sergeants and master sergeants is usually 2:4:3:1

#### ESTABLISH A FULL ELIMINATION MECHANISM



Training and assessment results, physical examination conclusions, and mental health are comprehensively evaluated.

Candidates are usually selected based on 120% of the total number of personnel.



Female peacekeepers is one of the priorities.
