## II. Challenges in the United Nation Missions

- According to the report from the United Nation and from Cambodian troops in Central African (MINUSCA), one of the remaining challenges for the troops to perform the tasks is the lack of infrastructure such as temporary or wooden bridges to across creek line or river.
- As such, the National Centre for Peacekeeping Forces begins the initiative to seek for the capability that could temporarily transport the troops across the water such as PMP and TMM so that they could conduct the demining tasks effectively.

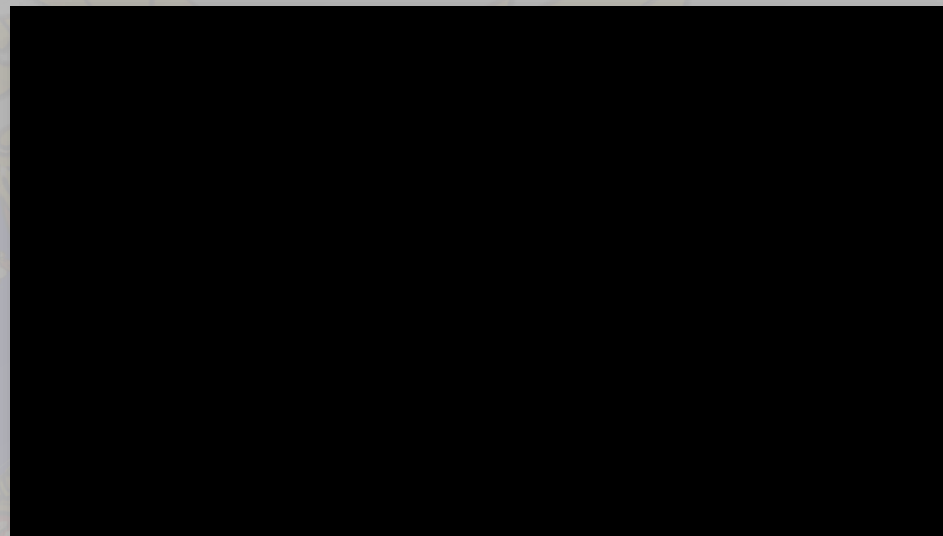
